Introduction to Research Methods

Thursday 19 May 08:45 am – 17:00 pm The Alfred Centre, Commercial Road, Melbourne

This one day introductory course will explore the fundamentals of undertaking research in a clinical environment.

It will introduce key terminology and processes with the intention of providing clinicians who have not previously undertaken or led research with the confidence and skills to contribute to this crucial element of the evidence based care continuum.

The course will be facilitated by leading clinician-researchers from The Alfred Hospital's Emergency & Trauma Centre, and senior academics from Monash and Deakin Universities. The course is designed for health professionals who hold a healthcare related undergraduate qualification but assumes no further prior knowledge or any research experience.

Introduction to Research Methods is accredited for 6.75 ACEM CPD hours and 7 ACRRM core points

Key learning areas:

- Development of answerable research questions
- Literature searching
- Displaying and summarising research data
- Basic statistical analyses
- Principles of research ethics



The Alfred Emergency & Trauma Centre also offers an "Introduction to Biostatistics" course in collaboration with Monash University. This is a separate one day program providing a more focused introduction to statistical theory and concepts. It is recommended that students complete the "Introduction to Biostatistics" course consecutively with the "Introduction to Research Methods".
